- 1. Identify the target group, e.g., school children, orphans, the sick in hospitals, street children, community children, etc.
- 2. Decide on the number you can manage to host.
- 3. Choose a hosting location, e.g., at the beach, event hall, private home, etc. Will you need to rent a venue?
- 4. If you are unfamiliar with poetry writing, reach out to a local/international poet or a poetry teacher to co-host with you.
- 5. Poems can be in any style, about anything, and in any language. The internet has ample information on children's poetry styles, e.g., cinquain, clerihew, diamond, etc.
- 6. Feel free to improvise or replace the idea of fire/lanterns.
- 7. Consider seeking sponsorship to cover some or all expenses, e.g., renting a venue, venue set up, poster production, etc.
- 8. Involve the local media for promotion and coverage.
- Promote the event by crediting the host/ess accordingly, e.g., "Fun Poetry Club presents WoChiPoDa 2016". Credit the founder of WoChiPoDa as deemed appropriate.
